


### Lots of noise on various internal market themes:

- Tech vs. everything else
- "Go out and spend" vs. "Stay at home" stocks
- But, does any of this mean anything from a portfolio management standpoint? Do we need to rotate?



## Growth vs. Value








### Growth vs. Value

#### Some conclusions:


- There have been multiple head fakes on the long sought-after rotation from growth to value, but the numbers are consistent: Growth is still consistently outperforming.
- Even during the tech drop in September, at the lows value only outperformed growth by about 400 basis points, which is nothing compared to the massive YTD outperformance from growth.
- Point being: Stick with growth until we get a catalyst for financials, industrials, or energy.






### Sector SPDRS

 Cyclicals have outperformed over the past three months (discretionary/materials) on hopes of stimulus/better data. But that's not value.





 Cyclicals have even held up well through the pullback, as materials, industrials, and consumer discretionary have outperformed.






### Get Out and Spend vs. Stay At Home (One Month)









## Get Out and Spend vs. Stay At Home (Three Month)








# **How Trump Wins**



- Trump currently has 125 "safe" electoral votes.
- That does not count Texas (38) and Georgia (16), which are currently classified as toss-ups. If he loses either, it's probably over.
- Adding those in, Trump has 179 "safe" electoral votes.
- He must then win: Ohio (18), Florida (29) North Carolina (15) and Iowa (6). That gets him to 247. If he doesn't win all these, it's probably over.
- At that point, there are five remaining states (NV/AZ/WI/MI/PA).
- He then needs to win Pennsylvania or Michigan and just one of the other four.
- If he just wins Wisconsin, he's got to win both Arizona and Nevada.



# How Biden Wins



- Biden currently has 226 "safe" electoral votes.
- If he wins Texas then he just has to win one other toss-up state and he's in.
- If he wins Florida, then he just needs any one of: Georgia, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Ohio, or Michigan.
- If he does not win Florida or Texas, he needs to win three out of five. (GA/NC/OH/PA/MI).
- If that doesn't happen, Biden can still win, but we're likely in for a long night (or few weeks) because the election will be very, very close.
